

Open Position: Teaching Artist Apprenticeship

Company Description: Imagine is an applied theatre company that uses creativity to spark discovery and flourishing in multigenerational communities— schools, community-based organizations, businesses, non-profit and other communities. - Willing and able to take on or learn administrative tasks
- 3-6 hours of time between both Teaching Artist training and Admin support tasks
- Can provide their own transportation

- Learn about Imagine’s integrated teaching approach based on restorative justice, student-centered, and inclusive teaching and learning
- Connect with a variety of educational theatre programming and workshops
- Learn how theatre practices are embedded into social emotional learning curriculum
- Learn how to facilitate conversations through practical theatre integration
- Assist the creation of lesson tools and see how technology fits in a classroom
- Get experience teaching and acquire classroom management strategies
- Reflect on your experiences and track your growth as an artist and person
- Learn the importance of tracking your time spent working and gain awareness of time management
- Assist administrative responsibilities: review the reports of other teaching artists, connect with their experiences in the classroom, track data throughout engagement events
- Assist in event production: support in event planning and coordinating
